With help of others we're preparing material for presentation and display at the meeting. Contributions of material – stories and, even better – photos –will be much appreciated. I'd welcome your calls to the above number. Specially we'd like to be sure we at least name all the Oatley doctors. So far we are aware by name of doctors Prott, Ruut, Ramah Juta, and Koutis of West Oatley, as well as a husband and wife (Indian born, perhaps) pair of doctors who (we are told) had a surgery on the corner of Mulga Road and Woronora Parade with surname pronounced as *Yohendrian*. We don't have anything on who practised after Dr. Ruut in his surgery in Mulga Road (except Dr. Koutis, later), or of doctors past and present associated with the practice on the corner of Mulga Road and Woronora Parade – or in the Letitia Street practice next to the Masonic Hall.

We'd really appreciate help with past doctors in East Oatley – particularly present contact details – Dr. Bill Muir, of course, tall Dr. Dick Thomson (?) who lived in Llewellyn St., quiet Dr. Campbell, a doctor whose name I can't recall who left to go to a practice at Braidwood in the 1960s or 70s, Dr. Sampson (?) who I think may have taken over the practice from Dr. Muir (I heard he was hit by a car and killed while jogging, or riding a bike) – Dr. Mary Lovell, and Dr. Toni Letton – and others I've forgotten but hopefully you remember!

Please help - ring me with your memories and stories of any Oatley doctor – e.g., names, locations, any community involvements, where the doctors lived, their appearance, mannerisms, sports, hobbies, cars they drove, where their children went to school, traumatic experiences, etc etc. If presenting written information at the meeting please don't forget to include your name and contact details.

Where was Oatley's first doctor surgery?? The answer will be a surprise to everybody at the next meeting – certainly to the member who quite unknowingly is presently living in the actual building, where that doctor practised! A clue – it was in East Oatley (well before Dr. Muir)!!!!

In recent months we've received lovely letters (and stamps) from ex-Oatleyans Margaret Callaghan( nee Burke) and Nola Bentley, still displaying a keen interest in Oatley and supplying information. Well done!
