When one compares this happy state of affairs with the situation of a few years ago when only two Junior clubs were functioning in the St. George District namely, Sth. Hurstville and Sutherland, one realises and appreciates that this game of ours has not lagged behind any other code in the progress it has made.

It is not my intention now to bring under your notice the part the St. George District R.U.F.C. has played in this development beyond stating that considerable assistance has been and will continue to be given, but I would mention at this stage the name of one of our Life Members Mr. J. B. Bryant, who some 15 years ago sought leave of absence from the committee to form the Sth. Hurstville Royals and his dream of a St. George Junior competition has now been realised although he retired some years ago due to indifferent health.

Naturally the District Club executive is delighted with the enthusiasm and enterprise on the part of all concerned with the clubs participating in the various competitions and whilst minor difficulties and misunderstandings have arisen during the formative years these are being successfully ironed out, and will result in a strong and well regulated body. This in turn will ensure a steady flow of experienced and well coached players for the District club.

Whilst I am loathe to single out any particular individuals for the part they have played in development of the code among the juniors I feel I must mention the names of Messrs. Col. Redmond, Bert Timms, Bruce Harper and Harry Templeton and also refer to all those other grand workers to numerous to mention whose only reward is the very satisfying experience of being associated with this grand game and providing clean healthy sport for a growing number of youngsters.

In conclusion I extend on behalf of the District Club best wishes for the completion of a happy and successful season and express the hope that next year will be one of continued pleasure and progress.

St. George J.R.U. Presidents Message

Today marks the "coming of age" of the St. George Junior Rugby Union—we have graduated from the "kiddies" to the "big boys" as any one watching today's feature match (the under 18's) will soon realise when comparing it with our feature games of two or three years ago. Although we held a similar day at the end of last year it was not on such a lavish scale and was held outside our great sporting district.

When we started in the 1958 season many onlookers wished us well but forecast failure and death in infancy. In five seasons we have consolidated our original clubs and expanded from five clubs fielding 14 teams in two competitions to 10 clubs fielding 47 teams in seven grades. Next season we anticipate, without in any way being over optimistic, 9 or 10 grades and 70 teams—an indication we have survived our childhood and are enjoying fruitful adulthood. It is also pleasing to note that there are over 20 boys playing in today's matches with five years' experience behind them and another 20 or 30 in their fourth year. Our success has proved, despite many ups and downs, that localised football for young boys is the most popular provided there is reasonable opportunity, without an excessive amount of travel, for adequate grading according to standard, as the boys get older. I feel this can be successfully achieved by continued co-operation with our neighbouring Union, Easts-Randwick, in running joint competitions in certain grades, for at least the next two years.

The 1962 season has not been without some problems, particularly in regard to the introduction of our comprehensive system of registration of players which we feel is currently the best. But we have overcome them and have had a most enjoyable season which I hope will only be surpassed by an even better season in 1963.

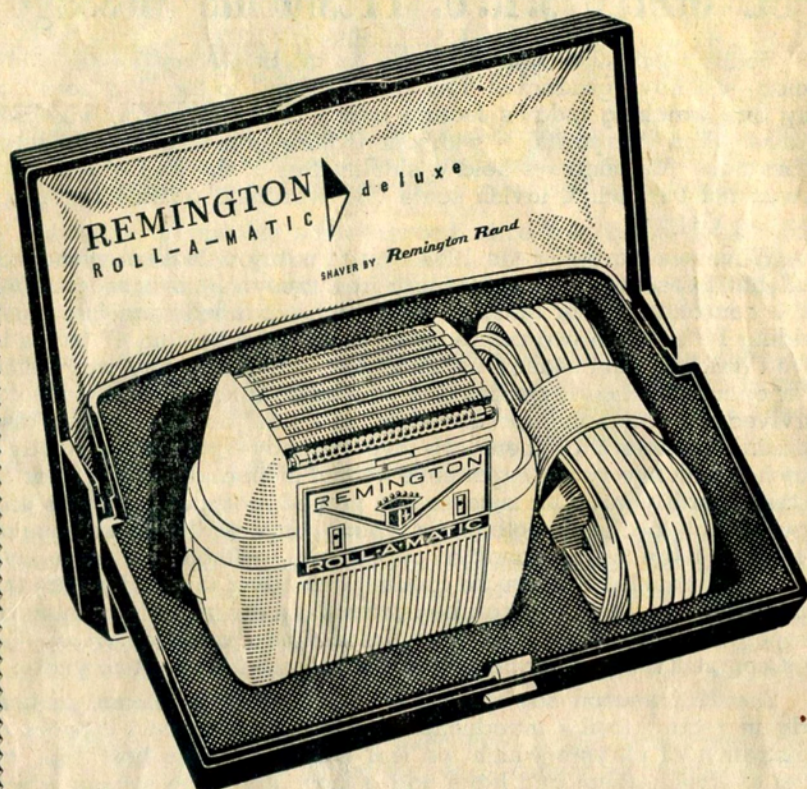
