BARRACLOUGH REPORT

Well! What a difference a year makes.

With the success of 1989 behind us, Oatley started their campaign to defend their title. Unfortunately, however, only two players from last year's 1st Grade and two players from the Premiership 3rd Grade sides were available and I, as the new coach, had challenges you couldn't jump over.

After receiving a great deal of help from the Committee and fellow players, and with phone bills hitting the roof, we started to take shape for the first round of the competition. A shortage of backs throughout the Club had the 1st Grade backline looking like a who's who of Oatley pub on a Friday night. Not to be denied, the team (led by Keith Bennett from inside-centre) won their first six games in a row to be undefeated leaders going into Round 7.

Up to this stage of the season we had obtained the services of Benny Manu, Esa Toga and Luke Johnson in our backline; were averaging 21 points to 6; and had scored 22 tries to 3. However, heads started to grow and training was lacking the attendance it deserved, hence, our next game (which was against the eventual premiers, CBOBS) was our first loss. Many teams experience a slump during the season--this game was just the beginning of ours--four losses in the next five games, including a loss to last placed Kings Old Boys.

These losses were due to a number of reasons: Adrian Moss out for 6 weeks with rib cartilage damage; Mick Waudby overseas for 5 weeks; and the dropping of 5 players for 1 game for not attending training. To the players who played against King's OB--Anthony "Smudge" Craig, Paul O'Rourke, "Boxhead", Lindsay Shorten and Matt Duff--a big thank you. "Smudge" received 2 points from the referee; Lindsay played strongly; Paul O'Rourke scored 2 tries; "Boxhead" showed he's got the ability if he wants to be serious about his rugby; and Matt Duff was solid.

With the season half over we were getting stronger and, although, the team was now lying in around third position, we were pleased to see some old faces appear at Evatt Park--namely Murray Smee, Gary Matthews and Nigel Corkin.

Also, at about this time, a change in the Captaincy occurred when Keith Bennett was put out by a knee operation. Ged Oldfield took over the Captaincy and led the team well until "Mad-Dog" made his 3 o'clock return.

By now Moss, Waudby, Smee, Corkin and Matthews were all back and 1st Grade's jigsaw was nearly in place. Then the unbelievable happened--we lost Benny Manu for a 12-week holiday and Esa Toga disappeared into the mist. Still, we won games with very capable replacements in Anthony Craig and Geoff Agius who played the very best every weekend till the end.

First Grade beat Chatswood in the second-last game of the season to confirm our semi-final berth. So, after a few weeks of double training nights and a fine win over St.Leo's, February's impossible dream had come true.

Our semi-final was, once again, against St.Leo's Old Boys. We went into this game organised, prepared and ready for the war ahead as we all knew we had to play the game of our lives if we were to win back-to-back comps. Although we had lost Nigel Corkin through retirement only 2 weeks earlier, the backs were primed for big games.

The most exciting game of the season turned into my biggest disappointment after only 5 minutes when we lost our Captain for the rest of the game on a Touch Judge's report. Still, the boys rallied and went down by only 3-7 against a strong forward pack which had to fight right to the very end against our 7 heroes. Although upset and left wondering about what could have been, I was very proud of the Oatley 1st XV that afternoon.

As with all clubs and every season, there are people who deserve thanks and I, too, have some special people who I wish to thank.

To Peter Sciberras who helped me out when the second-row position needed to be filled against Knox OB's and for his leadership against a couple of clubs, which resulted in wins, a big thanks mate. Julie Ference for her help with the 1st Grade warm ups, although the guys think you should wear shorts next season.

Gary Gainsford, Max Currie and Andrew Momsen for their guidance and thoughts throughout the year.

To a guy who couldn't get a run in 1st Grade last year Rod "Ironman" Dunn, who didn't miss a game the whole year and, more importantly, was at every, yes every, training session during the season. A great effort !.

My Manager Keith Adams, who was always on hand, had everything the players required and, most importantly, nothing was ever any trouble for Keith. Keith is a coach's delight and he made the 1st Grade team that much more prepared for the games.

With all this support, the 1st Grade was successful to the utmost, but no club can survive or run smoothly if your club committee isn't strong. Ours was very supportive and my gratitude goes out to Laurie McMartin and his fellow committeemen for a grand effort.

I hope there aren't too many retirements for 1991 and that a goal kicker may turn up at Evatt so we can go those couple of games further next season.

RICHARDSON REPORT

The 1990 Rugby Season was a season of experimentation for the Oatley 4th Grade team. We experimented with 2 part-time coaches--1 a forward and 1 a back. Sometimes both coaches were present, occasionally only 1 coach was present and, more often than not, no coach was present. We experimented with between 50 and 60 different players. Unfortunately, we weren't able to field them all at the same time. We also experimented with every position on the paddock--each week--we even tried Adam Abidan at centre--ONCE! 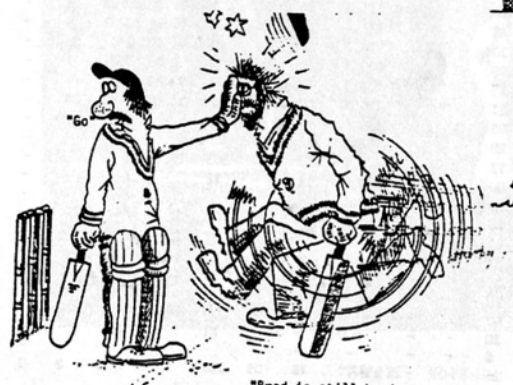

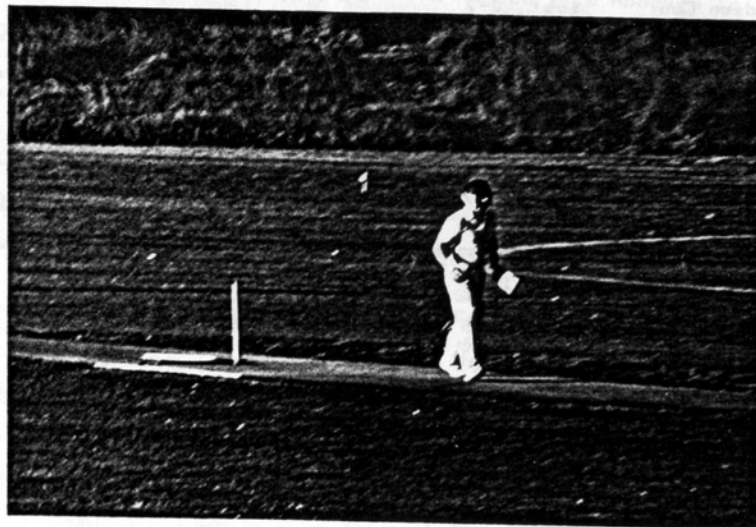
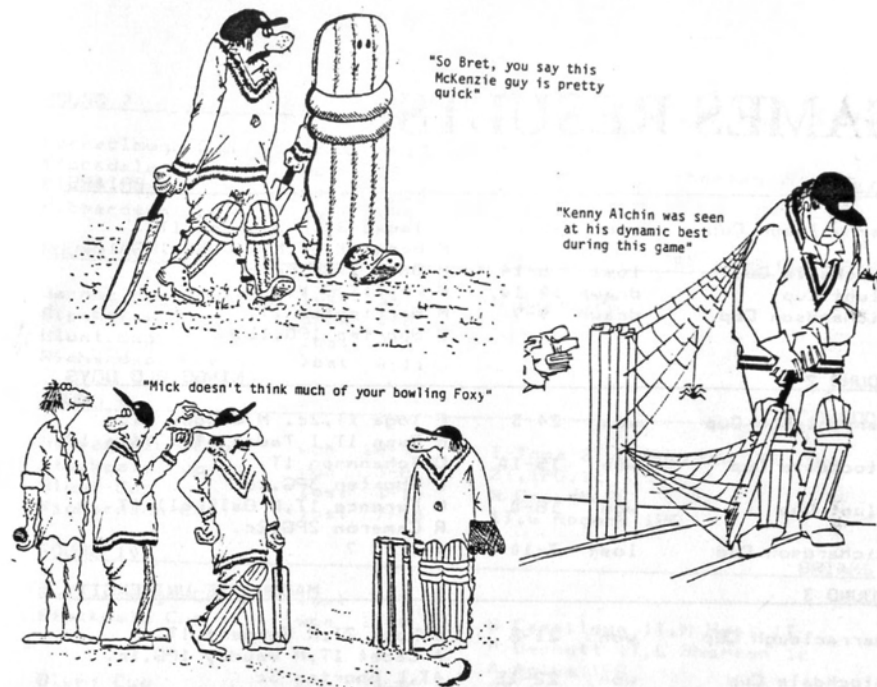
