ANNUAL REPORT AND MEMENTO OF 1966 SEASON

Foreword by President

I hope that the majority of Oatley players and supporters are not disappointed by the results of the season just completed. I can assure you all that I am not! True, we did win only one premiership, but looked at purely from the point of view of competitions, we had a record number of eight teams in semi finals and four teams made great efforts to win through to their Grand Finals, a worthy effort when the increased number of Clubs in the district is considered. However, I believe that the main causes for our satisfaction lie elsewhere. This season we registered no fewer than 54^{new} players, which makes us a very large sporting organisation indeed, and these players were given the opportunity to play Rugby of a high standard and to enjoy doing so. To do this, we have to thank our Coaches and Managers and other officials for their enthusiastic and unselfish work. We have gone through the season with a very happy spirit evident between our players, officials and supporters and this is more important to my mind, than winning at all costs.

It has been said that Oatley teams would win more games if our players had more "fire", but when "fiery play" often means the same as "dirty play", I believe we are better suited to the spirit of Rugby when we remain friendly with our opponents, and this has been noticeable with Oatley teams in all age groups. For the players and supporters who believe that the rules of Rugby are complicated, perhaps it might be interesting to quote the five original rules

under which the game was played in Great Britain after it had been decided that the rules should be the same throughout the country. These were:

1. You shall not play unfairly.
2. You shall not play when offside.
3. You shall ~~not~~ release the ball when tackled.
4. You shall not pass the ball forward.
5. You shall catch the ball cleanly. (i.e. don't knock on)

Looked at in this light, they seem to cover the spirit of the game, and I think No. 1 is the most important. I trust that Oatley teams will continue to observe this particular rule in all games, and that, win or lose, we retain our reputation as "good sportsmen".

At the end of another pleasant and successful football season I congratulate our players on their skill and sportsmanship, also I express the hope that they have benefited physically from the exercise undertaken, and socially from the discipline, tuition, successes, failures, friendships and interests which are all part of belonging to a football team. I express gratitude to all officials for their ready support and assistance particularly those who do not have sons playing in the teams under their control.

It is true that hard dry grounds have made playing conditions severe during 1966, however, care of gear and laundry has been less of a problem for mothers than has been the case in past wet winters.

Our Under 18 team, having won their St. George Premiership has advanced to the City of Sydney finals and is due to play Mosman for the title "City of Sydney Winner" on Saturday, September 10th. This magnificent achievement by our senior team, which will not greatly surprise supporters who have seen that talented group in action, merits our highest congratulations. The Under 10 City of Sydney Championship for 1966 has been won by South Hurstville Royals, another St. George J.R.U. club. For that success and for again winning the St. George Club Championship we extend hearty congratulations to South Hurstville Club.

With interstate visits again a feature of the 1966 season at Oatley, teams were able to visit and entertain players from Brisbane and Tasmania. The officials who arranged these visits have asked that we express sincere thanks to all those people who have billeted our visitors.

Congratulations of this club are offered to BRUCE BATTISHALL for the success he has achieved during 1966 with the St. George Senior Club and especially for winning the 1966 Fairfax Trophy.

We may come to associate this season with the return of the "Ians" as we were happy to welcome back IAN DUNCAN, IAN McKECKNIE, IAN THOMPSON also JOHN LUNDY and JEREMY SHEEN.

At our most recent meeting of club officials it was decided that a single club function in the form of a picnic to cater for all age groups would be the most desirable type of presentation function for 1966. In view of the hazards experienced by JIM YEOMANS and myself in arranging the 1965 car trial we were inclined to agree. We wouldn't have thought it possible that any countryside could have changed so much in the two weeks between setting car trial clues and the actual trial date. How could we know that the Teacher would marry in the meantime and that someone would demolish the school without leaving any trace of the well! It is hoped that all players, officials and supporters will come along to the club picnic to be held at MENAI SPORTS GROUND on SUNDAY, 18th SEPTEMBER, 1966. A programme of events has been arranged and trophies will be presented by St. George Captain, EDDIE STAPLETON.

CREDITS:

The opportunity is taken of expressing thanks to some of the people who have helped make our 1966 activities so enjoyable.

We thank all parents for their support also for providing our officials with such talented players. It was pleasing to again welcome new players and officials.

An examination of our Treasurer's report will indicate that club finances are in a satisfactory state and we thank social secretary, BETTY SANDERS, for the outstanding achieve-

ments of her committee in helping make this situation possible.

Club Patron, Alderman CURLISA has again rendered every assistance to the club. We thank him for his help, for the interest he has taken in club affairs and for his attendance at many games.

Again our thanks go to Aldermen and Officials of Hurstville Council for their assistance in making grounds available for training, competition matches and social matches. We thank Mrs. HOSEY and Mr. MULLANE for displaying club notices, also Mrs. CREER for supplying Honour Badges.

Treasurer NOEL ECCLESTON, Publicity Officer RON HOLT, and Gear Steward DICK ADAMS have all rendered outstanding service. Other officials willingly assisted as ground marshalls and when required for marking grounds, erecting and dismantling goal posts and carrying out various duties at final matches.

THE MATCH:

Late in the season a social football match was arranged between our Under 14 team and a team of officials. Although no official reason for arranging such a match has been given it was popularly considered some form of penance on the part of Messrs MORT, STAPLES and partners.

It was pleasing to see coaches and managers brilliantly displaying all the theory they had been imparting to their teams during the season although none really qualified for his Honour Badge.

The game was remarkable from many points of view. This was the first occasion on which an Oatley team has taken the field with 15 reserves standing by and really needed them.

Because of the rapidity with which play and players switched from end to end (also from side to side) it was difficult to accurately keep score, however, it was reliably reported at the start that a drawn game was expected. I have no reason to doubt that this result was achieved.

It was apparent from the start that the Referess, several were required for this contest, were extremely biased. To which side they were biased was less apparent.

Generally play was according to the Laws of Rugby with omission of several fiddling technicalities such as Offside, Knock-On and Scrum Infringements. A number of experimental rules were introduced with the result that a wildly partisan group of spectators saw a free flowing game - towards fulltime the flow was reduced to a dribble.

Supporting play was a feature of the Officials' team - it was wonderful how those reserves tottered in from the sideline as each of their associates dropped from exhaustion. It was also fortunate that the Under 14 forwards were present to prevent the scrums from collapsing - again from exhaustion.

Regrettably it was necessary for the Officials' team to dispense with the usual concluding formality of cheering their opponents - through shortage of breath.

THE PLAYERS:

Once again Oatley players in all age groups have given club officials every reason to be proud of them. The standard of play in our St. George Junior Rugby Union continues to improve each year and our players are well up to standard. In most teams attendance at training and matches has been excellent. We sincerely thank those players who have been reserves for one or more matches for cheerfully accepting the

fact that reserves are a very necessary part of every team.

During 1966 six of our players played their 100th official match for Oatley. They were PAUL SANDERS, BRIAN SMITH, LEE JACKSON, MARTYN YEOMANS, JOHN ARMSTRONG and ROSS ROBERTSON, all of whom will be awarded club medallions at the presentation picnic. We offer them hearty congratulations.

Players who have not already done so are asked to return their jersey to the team manager immediately.

UNDER 8 TEAM:

These little chaps learned a lot about football and sportsmanship from coach TONY HALL and manager VINCE DAVISON. With most of the players having their first season of Rugby it was pleasing to welcome them to our club along with officials Tony and Vince. We thank them for providing us with enormous interest throughout the 1966 season and extend them congratulations for reaching the semi-final which they were unlucky to lose by 6 points to 3. The team won 8 matches and lost 7. Points for/against were 126/92.

UNDER 9 TEAM:

With a number of experienced and talented players available from last season the Under 9 team performed very well to reach the finals. Coached by LES MORT and managed by GEORGE HIGGINS players showed marked improvement as the season progressed, capping a good 6-3 semi-final win with a determined effort in the final match against Rockdale. The team won 12 matches, drew 4 and lost 3. Points for/against were 107/42.

UNDER 10 TEAM:

Partly comprising players from the 1965 Under 9 premier-ship side our Under 10's failed to repeat the previous performance but did very well to reach the finals where they were eliminated by the strong South Hurstville side. Enthusiastic coach LEN HUGHES and manager CLIFF SCOTT worked hard to provide newer

players with valuable tuition and playing experience. The team won 11 matches, drew 2 and lost 5. Points for/against were 74/64.

UNDER 11 WHITE TEAM:

With most players experiencing their first season of Rugby, our Under 11 White Team performed exceptionally well after getting off to a rather shaky start due to shortage of players. Once the team was established outstanding keenness was shown by all members; this must have given coach BOB HILL and manager JACK SLACK considerable satisfaction and should ensure outstanding results for Oatley in the Under 12 age group next season.

UNDER 11 BLACK TEAM:

Settling down well after a number of changes in personnel due to formation of a second team in this grade, the Under 11 Black side played good football to reach the semi-finals. Once again coach HARRY WARD and manager DON BAUGENT devoted a lot of time and effort in training this group. Defeat in the semi-final was by the barest margin, with the score even at full time and De La Salle forcing a score in extra time. The team won 12 matches, drew 1 and lost 4. Points for/against were 242/54.

UNDER 12 TEAM:

The Under 12 team had a very successful season of Rugby this year. Highlights were the visit to Brisbane and the regaining of the Brisbane-Oatley Trophy and a 9-0 win over Blakehurst in the final, enabling the team to play in a Grand Final for the first time. The team was a happy one and much of the success was due to the fact that team spirit and comradeship were always high. Attendance at training was excellent and the reserves were always on hand when needed. Coach LAWRENCE YEOMANS and manager KEITH POWELL greatly appreciated the excellent support given by Under 12 parents. The team had their line crossed only 7 times during the season. They won 12 matches, drew 1 and lost 4. Points for/against were 277/34.

UNDER 13 TEAM:

The team was coached by DICK ADAMS and managed by KEN HODGES. Hampered throughout the season by shortage of players

and adversely affected by the 1966 change in qualifying age the team did not win many matches. However, many of the boys displayed exceptional talent and most stuck to the job well throughout the season despite disappointing results. Mr. Adams and Mr. Hodges merit our thanks and congratulations for the interest they have taken in this group.

UNDER 14 TEAM:

Following a number of changes in personnel and playing positions early in the season coach KEN STAPLES again produced a fine team in this age group. Showing improvement throughout the season the team was narrowly beaten for the premiership. As usual, Ken aided by manager ALAN BEATH, was able to separate his flock from their homes and loved ones for yet another interstate trip. The exchange of visits with Tasmanian teams has been completed and everyone had a thoroughly enjoyable time. The team won 11 matches, and lost 5. Points for/against were 200/93.

UNDER 15 TEAM:

The competition in which this team played was very keenly contested, and all teams were of high standard. There were no "easy" games and our team played under pressure in every match. Oatley's team had great potential, which was unfortunately never fully realized due to a combination of circumstances such as absence of key players for a variety of reasons at critical times and also because team training was less than satisfactory due to the fact that training night did not suit 100% of the players. Due to the age adjustment and other reasons, no fewer than seven of last year's players were not available to play this season with the team and only one player (admittedly a great gain) dropped back from last year's Under 15's. In due course, five players new to Oatley Club were welcomed into the team and one player, Jeremy Sheen, came back to the fold after an absence of some years. Two of the new players, Peter Rose and John Wolfe were deservedly awarded our Club Honour Badges. A glance at statistics of games won and lost, and points for and against make it sound unlikely, but Oatley's playing ability was always respected by the other clubs, especially when Oatley was at full strength.

No matter what the result or the score, there was never moaning or recriminations within the team and there was always good fellowship between the players. Two games in particular are worthy of recall; the first against the strong Rockdale team when Oatley had only 12 players who played their hearts out in spite of the crushing 44 to nil defeat. After the game, we were complimented by our opponents for the spirit in which the match was played. In the following game against Rockdale, we fielded 15 players (even after Geoff Tattersall, who was ill had left the field) and in the last 10 minutes were doing a great job of bridging the gap of 3 to nil, until Mick Lloyd was injured and had to leave the field. This gave Rockdale a natural overlap which led them to a try for a 6 to nil win. Mention must be made of the co-operation of our Co-Managers, Mr. Martin Winney and Mrs. Edith Winney, who carried out the duty efficiently and also were always on hand with words of encouragement or sympathy for the team and the coach.

UNDER 16 TEAM:

The Under 16 team was coached by IAN DOWNS and managed by JACK MILGATE. It was pleasing to see the old stalwarts in this team sticking together and continuing to play good football. In addition, they gained a number of very talented new recruits, and served notice that they intended to eclipse last season's performances when they set a new record score of 97-0 early in the season. Once again they proved that they can rise to the occasion with a devastating display in the Grand Final, but unfortunately this time luck was against them and they were narrowly defeated. The team won 10 matches and lost 5. Points for/against were 270/102.

UNDER 18 TEAM:

The Under 18 team was coached by JOHN MAHONEY and managed by RAY BENJAMIN. The blending of new blood with the "Old Men" (players in their second under 18 season) in this team proved to be highly successful and in due course a really good team spirit developed. After an impressive start to the season with 11 straight wins, they suffered a slump in form which had their supporters developing ulcers. However, when the chips

were down in the final and grand final they again showed their true form, and the way they "torpedoed" their opponents in the grand final to take out the St. George premiership was most convincing. They have now won their way through to the City of Sydney final and stand the chance of becoming the first Oatley team to ever win this high honour. Their record to date is 17 wins and 3 losses. Points for/against so far are 275/128.

FINANCE:

Our Hon. Treasurer has submitted the following statement of income and expenditure to date.
