INFANTS SCRIPTURE CLASSES



INVITATION TO CRAFT



SWIMMING CARNIVAL - 1987

The Oatley West Public School Annual Swimming Carnival is being held this helday. 13th February, 1987 at Roselands Swimming Centre. Transport by bus has been arranged. The cost will be \$1.40 per child, covering the cost of the bus fare and entrance into the pool.

the buses will be leaving the school at 8.45 am so that the curnival can commende promptly at 9.00 am.

The children will need to be at school by 8.30 am. All children must travel by bus to the carmival, but may return home with their parents after they have necified their teacher. The full fare must still be paid. All children are to wear their school sports uniform with their swimming costumes undermeath. There are no bush provisions at the pool, so the children will need to bring their leach. They will also need a towel, sun cap and sun-tan lotion as there is very little shelter at the pool.

In line with the new Departmental Sports Policy and with the District Regional and State Swimming Carnivals for 1987, a few changes have been made to the organisation of our school carnival. These changes are as follows -

 Events previously known as "Boys" events are new being sailed "Open" events. e.g. Open 8 years - 25 metres Girls 8 years, 25 metres

Girls have the choice of competing in <u>cither</u> the "Open" event or the "Girls" event, but not both events. If a girl does wish to compete in the "Open" event, then she must continue to do so at the District, Regional and State Carnivals.

Swimming Carnival (Cntd)

- (2) There is a new age division in the Form Strokes, that being an 11 years age division. The Major and Minor Divisions no longer apply. The new divisions are -
 - E.G. Open 8 9 10 yrs 50M Backstroke Girls 8 9 10yrs 50M Backstroke Open 11 years 50M Backstroke Girls 11 years 50M Backstroke Girls 12.13 yrs 50M Backstroke

Please note that these divisions do not apply for relay teams. They remain as Senior Relays (11,12,13 years) and Junior Relays, (3,9,10 years)

- (3) Events previously known as "Open" events are now called "All Age" events.
 - E.G. Open All Age 100 metres Freestyle; 200 metres Medicy Girls All Age 100 metres Freestyle; 200 metres Medicy
- (4) Only 2 swimmers for each event are eligible to compete in the District Swimming Carnival, including the freestyle events

As with our previous school carnivals, children swim in events according to the age they turn in 1987. Children who turn 8 years or 9 years in 1987 have the choice of swimming in either a 25 metres freestyle event or a 50 metres freestyle event, but not both. They should consider that there is no 25 metre event at the District Swimming Carnival. If they wish to be eligible for the District Carnival they have to swim 50 metres.

There will be novelty events for all children. All parents are very welcome to some along and support their children and their house teams. A copy of the program of events will be sent home with the children later this week. Would all parents pleare sign the permission note below and return it to school with the \$1.40 bus thre/pool untrance, as soon as possible?

The Georges River District Swimming Carnival is on Friday, 20th February, 1987.
