Abbey Family in Oatley

OHHS recently received and email from Fran Ridley (living in Coffs Harbour) who was researching her family tree and one of the ancestors was the Abbey family from William (from 1916 Kitchener) street.

The info OHHS has and some supplied info is informally gathered in this document.

The following people living in William street in 1914. William street had a name change in about 1916 to Kitchener.

And I have Otto and Gertrude at 21 Kitchener in 1938 from electoral rolls.

Fran -- William built this home, his wife is Elizabeth, and the other names are his children, Leonorah is not there but she is my fathers mother. Have photos of most of them if they are needed by you. Have been doing family tree since 2001, and this is a gap i was trying to fill.


Just to add to the mix - Jan and I owned the 21 Kitchener Street property, for only a short number of years, during the 1960s. When we bought it the house, previously on it, had been


demolished except for the very dark brick footings. After demolition and removal of the footings, the property was vacant for some years until we sold it to friends Max and Diana Jackson who built on it the house that is still there, in which the Jackson family then lived. Some years after Max's death, in the early 2000s, Diana in 2009 sold the property to Ray and Laurie Taylor, the present owners.

I do not recall the name of the previous owner from whom Jan and I bought 21 Kitchener Street Oatley, in the 1960s, but believe a family called Pilkington lived there for a number of years, probably up until demolition of the house. Mr. Pilkington who came originally from Victoria was a close friend to the late Professor James 'Jim' Douglas, of Oatley.

William Abbey and wife Elizabeth, with son Otto and daughter-in-law Gertrude, were living in the weatherboard house on 21 William Street (as it was then) at Boxing Day, 26th December, 1911. Another son, 35 year old stud groom Wilfred Abbey who lived in a separate house in William Street with wife Martha and 7 year old surviving son William, came to 21 Kitchener Street and fired several shots from a rifle, one wounding his mother in the neck, then went outside where he killed himself with a gunshot to the head.

A report of an inquest on Wilfred's death said he suffered from fits, and had suffered from "water on the brain".
