



The Committee has considered a number of options for new plaques, to utilise the grant received through David Coleman's office and is proposing the following plaques:

- Oatley Pleasure Grounds
- The Needwood Walk at the commencement of the walkway to Como (to commemorate Oatley's original name)
- First Contact Oatley January 1788, hopefully to be located near the Hills Peak Lookout in Oatley Park

## The Oatley Grant Walk

At this stage, this is now planned for Friday 7 October. Further details will follow nearer to the date.

#### **Mr Russell Gibbs**

Russell Gibbs (1921-2002) was the founder of the Oatley Heritage and Historical Society. He presided over the inaugural meeting of the society in July 1995. This well attended meeting held in the Oatley Library set the direction for the group of local people interested in preserving the heritage of Oatley. The group quickly became known as the Oatley Heritage Group and Mr Gibbs remained the president over the first five, formative years. It was his drive and vision that ensured the continuation of the group into the 21st century.

Mr Gibbs' view was that the purpose of the Oatley Heritage Group was to "gather information, enjoy the past and let our children enjoy the future". It was his steady stewardship of the OHG that ensured its survival and progress.

For this reason, the Oatley Heritage and Historical Society, which evolved from the OHG, wishes to honour Mr Gibbs in some lasting way. The Society is seeking to mark his memory and his profound contribution to the Society; so we ask members to, as Russell would say, "put their thinking caps on" and come up with ways of remembering him.
