GRC has also approved our nomination of a GRC Blue plaque on the site of the previous plaque that was stolen in 1990's in front of the Oatley Hotel for the author John O'Grady.

Finally, we will be nominating two sites for the NSW Government Blue plaque programmethe sites we are applying for are the Tasmanian Regiment remains in Oatley Park and the Oatley Amateur Swimming Club established in 1927.
