# Winners of race for fun mosey down to the pool

MITCHELL Reece. 5, and Ray Stevens. 76. (pictured on page 10) are at opposite ends of the age spectrum but both are kids at heart when it comes to taking a dip in the Georges River.

They are just two of the 80-odd Oatley Amateur Swimming Club members who would rather take the plunge in a salty, bush park pool than line up on the blocks at an Olympic-sized venue.

Each spring and summer Sunday, club members gather at Oatley Park for their version of a race meet.

Camaraderie. rather than competitiveness, is the driving force and freestyle could just as easily mean dog paddle.

"All the other clubs are too competitive for us," he said. "We're not in it to win anything. We just swim for the fun of it." Nevertheless, Oatley's formula has proven a winning one. This Saturday, the club celebrates its 70th birthday.

It was founded by a group of returned World War I servicemen at a time when river inlets were being netted off all over the district for community swimming pools.

The river pools provided cool relief in summer and a social outlet for families who did not have the transport to get to the Olympicsized pools at Enfield, North Sydney and Granville.

But after World War II, the balance shifted. More households had cars and more council pools were springing up in the suburbs. The river pools became neglected as swimmers flocked to the crystal-clear, tideless, artificial swimming holes.

Oatley, however, proved an exception. Mr Stevens, who has

swum with the club for 67 years, said Oatley owed its popularity to its tranquil setting and lack of sporting prowess.

"Most of our swimmers wouldn't be of much interest to other clubs because they don't care if they win or lose," he said.

"We have kids who are just learning to swim and older people who just want to relax. They can wear flippers for all we care. It's the social aspect of the club that people come for."

The closest thing to an Olympic champion to emerge from the club was Mr Stevens' brother, Frank, who swam backstroke in the 1950 Commonwealth Games.

But while Oatley Amateur Swimming Club might never make a splash on the international circuit, its looks like staying afloat for a long time to come.
